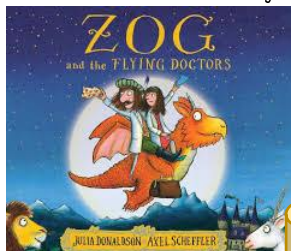


English - Zog and the Flying Doctors.
