In English this week, the children have been exploring *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. They stepped into the shoes of Puck, creating monologues, using rhetorical questions and subordinating conjunctions to add depth and drama. Their creativity brought Puck's chaos and mischief to life brilliantly!

Maths

This week in Maths, we completed our Fractions unit. The children subtracted fractions with confidence, including subtracting fractions from whole and mixed numbers. They have shown fantastic progress in applying their understanding to tricky calculations.

Geography

In Geography this week, the children learned about the benefits and challenges of tourism in Paris and the Paris Basin. They explored economic growth as well as considering issues such as overcrowding and pollution. To show their understanding, the children created posters split into two halves – one for benefits and one for challenges – showcasing well-balanced ideas.

To celebrate World Maths Day on the 25th March, the children stepped into the role of meteorologists and created their very own weather forecasts.

They began by analysing data – identifying the highest and lowest temperatures of the week, calculating the average temperature, and working out which day would have the most rainfall. After this, they presented their findings by creating bar charts to show the temperature changes across the week.
